<u>Utah State of Higher</u> <u>Education</u> Opportunity Scholarship

Take CE and/or AP courses in Math, English, and Science.

<u>Utah State of Higher</u> <u>Education</u> <u>First Credential Scholarship</u>

Take at least 5 General Ed. Concurrent Enrollment courses.

Utah State Board of Education CTE Scholarship

Enroll in a <u>JATC program</u> or take many CTE courses to be a <u>Pathway Completer</u>.

Honors English - To better prepare you for CE and/or AP courses for 11th and 12th grade.

Honors Sec. Math 2 or 3 - Seek guidance from your counselor for proper placement <u>and</u> pre-reqs for future CE and/or AP Math courses.

AP Enviro. Science AP Physics (Pre-req. of Sec. Math 3)

Scholarships for taking CE courses? You bet!

SLCC CE Transition Scholarship

- For students matriculating to SLCC after HS graduation.
- Must complete at least 6 credit hours of CE credit. (That's 2 SLCC CE courses)
- SLCC GPA of 2.0 or better.
- Must be FAFSA eligible.
- \$1000 \$1500 (tuition waiver) for the first 2 semesters.

Weber State EDGE Scholarship

- For students matriculating to WSU as full-time students.
- Must complete 9 credit hours of WSU CE credit.
 (That's 3 WSU CE courses)
- WSU GPA must be 3.0 or better.
- Must be a Utah resident and a US citizen.
- Tuition waiver each year for four years (\$1,000 per semester for eight semesters).

<u>U of U Concurrent</u> Enrollment Scholarship

- For students matriculating to U of U as first year, first time students.
- Must complete 9 credit hours of *transferrable CE courses.
- All CE courses must receive a Bor better.
- Must not have other grant or scholarship assistance from federal, state, or university merit sources.
- Must confirm your "Intent to Enroll" to accept this scholarship
- Must be enrolled as a full-time student, registering for at least 12 credit hours each semester.
- \$3000 per academic year, and renewable if in good standing.

^{*} Credits earned through the concurrent enrollment program are transferable from one $\underline{\rm USHE~institution}$ to another.

Other money-saving ideas to consider for college and beyond:

- **5** Take **Concurrent Enrollment**, **AP**, **CTE**, or a combo of all 3 in high school. Why?
 - <u>CE courses</u> are only \$5 per credit hour. College tuition for 1 CE course is \$15-\$20!
 - AP course exams are about \$103 (per exam) and successful credit can go just about anywhere!
 - CTE courses (at HHS or JATC) allow you to "sample" what you want to do or study and some programs send you off with a certification or licensure to start in a trade, work industry, or a college career!
- **5** Take courses that will count as **General Education requirements** for college graduation:
 - CE or AP English, Math, Science, History, Fine Arts, etc. (Remember, it's cheaper!)
 - Always seek the advice from a college academic advisor on what GE credits are needed for you!
- Take **college program prerequisite or foundation** courses before you get there! For example:
 - Nursing FHS 1500 and/or NUTR 1020 (offered at HHS)
 - Computer Sci./Programming CSIS 1400 &1410 or AP Comp Sci. or AP Comp. Sci. Principles (offered at HHS)
 - Engineering/Robotics EDDT 1010 and/or EDDT 1040, ENGR 1070 (offered at HHS)
 - Medical fields HS 1100, HLTH 1110 & 1111, RHS 2175, RHS 2300 (offered at HHS)
 - Art, Design, Graphics ART 1020, ART 1120, ART 1080, ART 1630, INTD 1010, FASH 1010 (offered at HHS)
 - Always seek the advice from a college/program advisor on what prerequisites would benefit you the most!
