This program was formerly an incentive loan program. It changed to a grant program in 2022.

The Talent Development Grant program is intended to recruit and train individuals to work jobs that have a high demand for new employees and offer high wages in Utah, ensuring students with the highest financial need are supported.

This program is available to recent high school graduates and adults who are enrolled in an eligible program at participating Utah public colleges and universities. Currently, these include:

Awards may be help cover up to the cost of resident tuition, fees, and books for the number of credit hours that student is enrolled in each semester. Recipients must be enrolled in an eligible program, declare their intent to pursue a qualifying degree and work in a qualifying job in Utah after graduation, complete a FAFSA, and apply for the grant.
